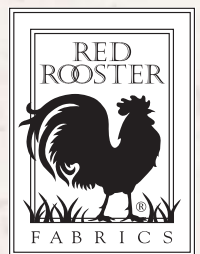

**Additional Fabrics:**

Backing: Pattern #18258 – GOL1 ..... 2 yards      Binding: Pattern #18258 – BRO1 ..... 2/3 yard  
 18255 – LTBE11 ..... 2 yards      Prepare 252" of binding from 2 1/8"-wide bias strips.  
 Batting: ..... 66" square

**NOTE:**

To make the best use of the fat quarters, cut the pieces in the order given, cutting the largest first.

The fabric placement in the alternate blocks and borders gives the illusion that the Squirrel in a Cage blocks are floating. In order to get the fabric and color placement right, it is recommended that the alternate squares and the pieced borders be laid out with the completed Squirrel in a Cage blocks before piecing them together.

## SQUIRREL IN A CAGE BLOCK:

- For each block, choose three fabrics and use the following pieces:  
Fabric 1 (medium) — one 2" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" strip and four F triangles.  
Fabric 2 (dark) — one 2" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" strip and four 2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" squares (D).  
Fabric 3 (light) — twelve F triangles.  
Also, use one dark brown 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" center square (E).

- Make four Square-in-a-Square units as follows:
  - Stitch a Fabric 1 triangle (F) and a Fabric 3 triangle (F) on opposite sides of a Fabric 2 square (D) (Figure 1).
  - Press the seams toward the triangles and trim off the points (Figure 2).
  - Stitch two Fabric 3 triangles (F) on the remaining two sides of square D (Figure 3).
  - Press the seams toward the triangles and square up to measure 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (Figure 4).

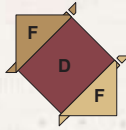

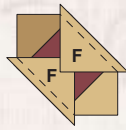

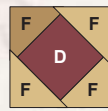
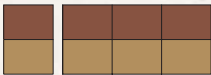

- Stitch the two 2" x 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" strips together along a long edge.
- Subcut this into four 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" segments (Figure 5).
- Assemble the block as shown (Figure 6). Square up to 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>".  
Make thirteen blocks.

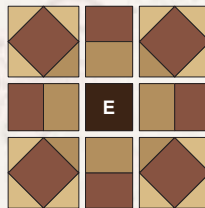

## ALTERNATE BLOCKS, CORNER BLOCKS AND BORDERS:

- Referring to the photo and the Quilt Diagram, lay the Squirrel in a Cage blocks out, placing the A triangles between them, matching the background fabric of each. Lay out the remaining A triangles along with Template AA and Template BB to make the borders.
- Stitch together the twelve alternate blocks (Figure 7). Square these up to 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>".
- Stitch a C triangle to each Template BB piece (Figure 8).
- Stitch each A triangle to a Template AA rectangle, keeping the pieces in the order they were laid out and facing the right direction (Figure 9).

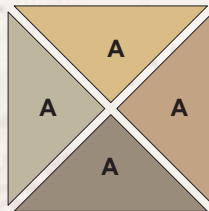

finishing at 8" each.

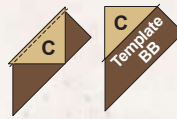

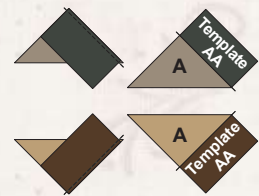

- Stitch together four border units, beginning with a Template BB unit, and then adding a Template AA unit (Figure 10).

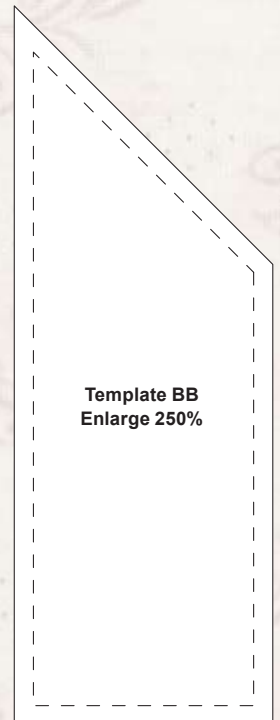


Figure 11 Make 4 border units measuring 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 40<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" each.

- Continue adding units in this way, pressing the seams toward the added units, to complete the border unit (Figure 11). Add a C triangle, and then trim the excess from the last Template AA even with the edge of C.

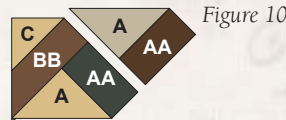
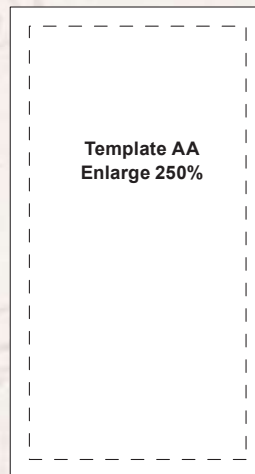

- Make four border units. These should measure 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 40<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>".
- Assemble four Square-in-a-Square blocks for the border corners, using the 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" B squares and the remaining C triangles. Square these up to 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>".



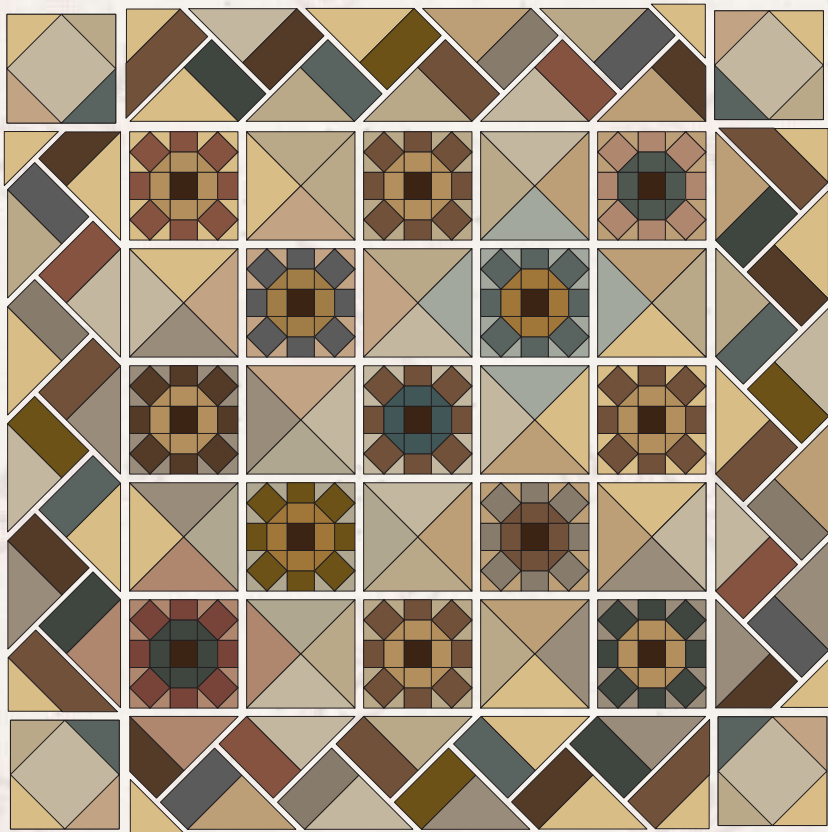

### **FINISHING:**

1. Stitch the quilt top together as shown in the Quilt Diagram.
2. Stitch the two backing fabrics together to measure at least 66" square.
3. From the binding fabric, cut and piece together 252" of 2 1/8"-wide bias strips.
4. Layer the quilt top with batting and the backing. Quilt as desired, trim the layers even, and attach the binding.
