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Sail Away

Finished Quilt Size: 60" x 73 1/2"

Finished Block Size: 12" x 12"

Materials

1 1/2 yards Lt. Blue Regatta Print (2788-5)
1 yard Cream w/Blue Dots (2793-50)
1 yard Cream w/Red Dots (2793-20)
5/8 yard Red Dot (2793-2)
1 yard Blue Sail Boat Print (2789-5)
3/4 yard Red Sail Boat Print (2789-2)
1/2 yard Red Stripe (2791-2)
1/2 yard Blue Stripe (2791-5)
1/8 yard EACH of: Blue Dot (2793-5), Blue Rope Print (2792-5), Red Rope Print (2792-2), Cream Regatta Print (2788-2), Lt. Blue Compass Print (2790-5), and Cream Compass Print (2790-2).
4 3/4 yards Coordinating Backing
2 1/2 yards Double-Sided, Lightweight, Fusible Webbing
Template Plastic

Cutting

(All strips are cut across the width of the fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge. Uncut yardage will be used for the appliqué.)

From the lt. blue regatta print, cut:

Six 7 1/2" strips for the outer border.
One 2" strip.

From EACH of the cream w/blue dots & cream w/ red dots, cut:

Two 12 1/2" strips. From each strip, cut three 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" squares.
One 2" strip.

From the red dot, cut:

Six 2 1/2" strips for the inner border.
One 2" strip.

From the blue sail boat print, cut:

Seven 2 1/4" strips for the binding.
One 2" strip.

From EACH of the remaining nine fabrics, cut:

One 2" strip.

Make the Appliqué Blocks

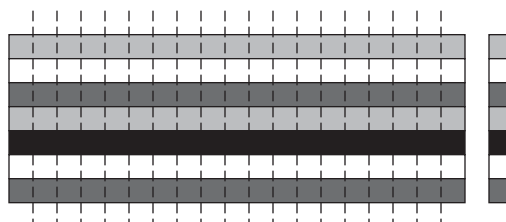
1. Using the paper patterns provided and template plastic, make a template for each shape. Each shape is already reversed and ready for tracing for fusible appliqué.
2. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace twelve of each shape onto the paper side of the fusible webbing. Leave at least 1/2" between shapes. Cut out each shape approximately 1/4" beyond the traced lines.
2. Again following the manufacturer's instructions, fuse the traced shapes onto the wrong side of the appropriate fabric. Trace six hulls and six main sails from each of the blue and red sail boat prints. Trace six head sails from each of the blue and red stripe fabrics noting orientation of the stripes. Cut out each shape on the traced lines.

3. Using the quilt pictured on the cover as a guide for placement, fuse a red hull, blue main sail, and red stripe head sail to a cream with blue dots square. Repeat to make a total of six blocks. Fuse a blue hull, red main sail, and blue stripe head sail to a cream with red dots square. Repeat to make a total of six blocks. Overcast each exposed edge of each shape with a machine buttonhole, satin, or other decorative stitch.

Quilt Assembly and Finishing

(All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam allowance.)

1. Sew seven of the 2" strips together as shown to make strip set #1. Choose any arrangement of fabrics you find pleasing. Press all seams in one direction. From this strip set, cut twenty 2" wide segments. Sew the segments together to make a long strip of 2" squares. From this long strip, create sixteen segments each consisting of eight squares. Remove seams between squares as necessary to make the segments.



2. Sew the remaining seven 2" strips together to make strip set #2. Press all seams in one direction. From this strip set cut twenty 2" wide segments. Sew four segments together end to end to make a long strip consisting of 28 squares. Repeat to make a total of five units. To create a more random fabric placement, remove some squares from the front of some long strips and move them to the end of that strip.

3. Sew three appliqué blocks and four units from step 1 together to make one block row. Use the quilt pictured on the cover as a guide to fabric placement. Repeat to make a total of four block rows.

4. Sew the block rows and the five units from step 2 together to complete the body of the quilt top.

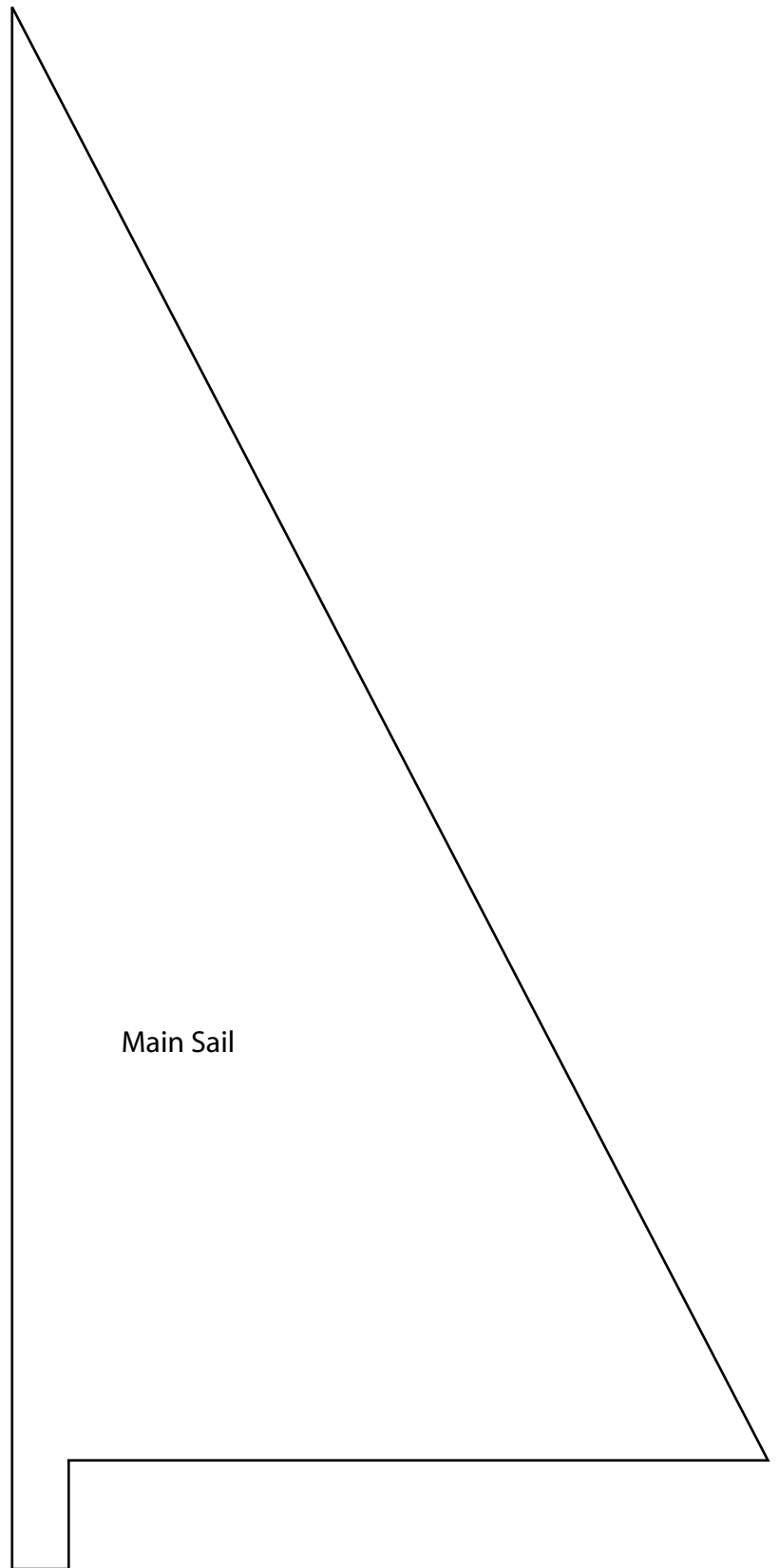
5. Trim the selvages from the 2 1/2" inner border strips. Sew the strips together end to end to make one long 2 1/2" strip. From this long strip, cut two pieces 2 1/2" x 56" and two pieces 2 1/2" x 46 1/2" (if your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt top). Sew one longer piece to the left and right-hand sides of the quilt top. Sew one shorter piece to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press all seams toward the inner border strips.

6. Trim the selvages from the 7 1/2" outer border strips. Sew the strips together end to end to make one long 7 1/2" strip. From this long strip, cut two pieces 7 1/2" x 60" and two pieces 7 1/2" x 60 1/2" (if your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt top). Sew one shorter piece to the left and right-hand sides of the quilt top. Sew one longer piece to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press all seams toward the outer border strips.

5. Layer the completed quilt with batting and backing and quilt as desired.

6. Bind the finished quilt using the 2 1/4" blue sail boat print strips.
